## Grammar

- -> It's the first time
- -> by the time

It's the first (second, third) time => followed by present perfect

## **Examples:**

It's the first time something has happened.

It's the first time I've driven a car.

This is the second time this has happened.

That's the third time he's phoned her this evening.

I.

When the main clause expresses **present or future perfect timing**, a **present tense verb form** is used in the **by-the-time phrase**.

## **Examples:**

By the time we get there, the bank will be closed.

By the time we get to the cinema, the film will already have started.

II.

A past verb form is used in the by-the-time phrase when the main clause expresses past perfect timing.

## **Examples:**

By the time we got to the cinema, the film had already started.

By the time she arrived, most of the other guests had left.
